§ 1-3. Continuation of existing provisions.

The provisions of the Code, insofar as they are substantively the same as those of local laws, ordinances and resolutions in force

immediately prior to the enactment of the Code by this local law, as distributed and renumbered in § 1-1 above, are intended as a continuation of such local laws, ordinances and resolutions and not as new enactments, and the effectiveness of such provisions shall date from the date of adoption of the prior local law, ordinance or resolution. All such provisions are hereby continued in full force and effect and are hereby reaffirmed as to their adoption by the Village Board of the Village of Canisteeo, and it is the intention of said Board that each such provision contained within the Code is hereby reaffirmed as it appears in said Code. Only such provisions of former local laws and ordinances as are omitted from this Code shall be deemed repealed or abrogated by the provisions of § 1-4 below.

§ 1-4. Repeal of enactments not included in Code.

All local laws and ordinances of a general and permanent nature of the Village of Canisteeo in force on the date of the adoption of this local law and not contained in such Code or recognized and continued in force by reference therein are hereby repealed from and after the effective date of this local law.

§ 1-5. Enactments saved from repeal; matters not affected.

The repeal of local laws and ordinances provided for in § 1-4 of this local law shall not affect the following classes of local laws, ordinances, rights and obligations, which are hereby expressly saved from repeal.

- A. Any right or liability established, accrued or incurred under any legislative provision of the Village of Canisteeo prior to the effective date of this local law, or any action or proceeding brought for the enforcement of such right or liability.
- B. An offense or act committed or done before the effective date of this local law in violation of any legislative provision of the Village of Canisteeo, or any penalty, punishment or forfeiture which may result therefrom.

- C. Any prosecution, indictment, action, suit or other proceeding pending, or any judgment rendered prior to the effective date of this local law, brought pursuant to any legislative provision of the Village of Canisteo.
- D. Any franchise, license, right, easement or privilege heretofore granted or conferred by the Village of Canisteo.
- E. Any local law or ordinance of the Village of Canisteo providing for the laying out, opening, altering, widening, relocating, straightening, establishing grade, changing name, improvement, acceptance or vacation of any right-of-way, easement, street, road, highway, park or other public place within the Village of Canisteo or any portion thereof.
- F. Any local law or ordinance of the Village of Canisteo appropriating money or transferring funds, promising or guaranteeing the payment of money or authorizing the issuance and delivery of any bond of the Village of Canisteo or other instruments or evidence of the village's indebtedness.
- G. Local laws or ordinances authorizing the purchase, sale, lease or transfer of property, or any lawful contract or obligation.
- H. The levy or imposition of special assessments or charges.
- I. The dedication of property.
- J. Any legislation relating to salaries.
- K. All legislation adopted subsequent to September 8, 1987.

§ 1-6. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, Article or part of this local law or of any local law, ordinance or resolution cited in the table in § 1-2 hereof, or any legislation included in this Code through supplementation, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, Article or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

§ 1-7. Copy of Code on file.

A copy of the Code, in loose-leaf form, has been filed in the office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Canisteeo and shall remain there for use and examination by the public until final action is taken on this local law; and, if this local law shall be adopted, such copy shall be certified to by the Village Clerk of the Village of Canisteeo by impressing thereon the Seal of the Village of Canisteeo, and such certified copy shall remain on file in the office of said Village Clerk to be made available to persons desiring to examine the same during all times while the said Code is in effect. The enactment and publication of this local law, coupled with the availability of a copy of the Code for inspection by the public, shall be deemed, held and considered to be due and legal publication of all provisions of the Code for all purposes.

§ 1-8. Amendments to Code.

Any and all additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to any of the local laws, ordinances and resolutions known collectively as the "Code of the Village of Canisteeo," or any new local laws or resolutions, when enacted or adopted in such form as to indicate the intention of the Village Board to be a part thereof, shall be deemed to be incorporated into such Code so that reference to the Code shall be understood and intended to include such additions, deletions, amendments or supplements. Whenever such additions, deletions, amendments or supplements to the Code shall be enacted or adopted, they shall thereafter be printed and, as provided hereunder, inserted in the loose-leaf book containing said Code, as amendments and supplements thereto. Nothing contained in this local law shall affect the status of any local law, ordinance or resolution contained herein, and such local laws, ordinances or resolutions may be amended, deleted or changed from time to time as the Village Board deems desirable.

§ 1-9. Code book to be kept up-to-date.

It shall be the duty of the Village Clerk to keep up-to-date the certified copy of the book containing the Code of the Village of

Canisteco required to be filed in the office of the Village Clerk for use by the public. All changes in said Code and all local laws and resolutions adopted by the Village Board subsequent to the enactment of this local law in such form as to indicate the intention of said Board to be a part of said Code shall, when finally enacted or adopted, be included therein by temporary attachment of copies of such changes, local laws or resolutions until such changes, local laws or resolutions are printed as supplements to said Code book, at which time such supplements shall be inserted therein.

§ 1-10. Sale of Code book; supplementation.

Copies of the Code may be purchased from the Village Clerk of the Village of Canisteco upon the payment of a fee to be set by resolution of the Village Board, which Board may also arrange by resolution for procedures for the periodic supplementation thereof.

§ 1-11. Penalties for tampering with Code.

Any person who, without authorization from the Village Clerk, changes or amends, by additions or deletions, any part or portion of the Code of the Village of Canisteco, or who alters or tampers with such Code in any manner whatsoever which will cause the legislation of the Village of Canisteco to be misrepresented thereby, or who violates any other provision of this local law, shall be guilty of an offense and shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) or imprisonment for a term of not more than fifteen (15) days, or both.

§ 1-12. Penalties for offenses.

Except where specifically provided elsewhere, any person who shall commit an offense against any provision of the Code of the Village of Canisteco shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a violation pursuant to the Penal Law of the State of New York, punishable by a fine not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.) or by imprisonment for not exceeding fifteen (15) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

§ 1-13. Changes in previously adopted legislation.

- A. In compiling and preparing the local laws, ordinances and resolutions for publication as the Code of the Village of Canisteo, as distributed and designated in the table in § 1-2 hereof, no changes in the meaning or intent of such local laws, ordinances and resolutions have been made, except as provided for in Subsection B hereof. In addition, certain grammatical changes and other minor nonsubstantive changes were made in one (1) or more of said pieces of legislation. It is the intention of the Village Board that all such changes be adopted as part of the Code as if the local laws, ordinances and resolutions had been previously formally amended to read as such.
- B. In addition, the following changes, amendments or revisions are made herewith, to become effective upon the effective date of this local law. (Chapter and section number references are to the local laws, ordinances and resolutions as they have been renumbered and appear in the Code.)¹

§ 1-14. Incorporation of provisions into Code.

The provisions of this local law are hereby made Article I of Chapter 1 of the Code of the Village of Canisteo, such local law to be entitled "General Provisions, Article I, Adoption of Code," and the sections of this local law shall be numbered §§ 1-1 to 1-15, inclusive.

§ 1-15. When effective.

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York.

§ 3-1. Legislative intent.

The intent of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Canisteo is to implement § 1402, Subdivision 3, of the Real Property Tax Law providing for the voluntary termination of the village's status as an assessing unit, as provided in the Village Law and the Real Property Tax Law. It is also the intent of this chapter to abolish the position of Assessor and to terminate any and all responsibility as provided by law or the review of the assessments of real property located within the Village of Canisteo.

§ 3-2. Village ceases to be assessing unit.

On or after the effective date of this chapter, the Village of Canisteo shall cease to be an assessing unit.

§ 3-3. Position of Assessor abolished.

The position of Assessor in the Village of Canisteo is hereby abolished.

§ 3-4. Board of Assessment Review abolished.

The Board of Assessment Review in the Village of Canisteo is hereby abolished.

§ 3-5. Levy; taxable status date.

On or after the effective date of this chapter, taxes in the Village of Canisteo shall be levied on a copy of the applicable part of the assessment roll of the Town of Canisteo, with the taxable status date of such town controlling for village purposes.

§ 3-6. Copy to be filed.

Within five days of the effective date of this chapter, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Canisteo shall file a copy of such local law with the Clerk and Assessor of the Town of Canisteo and with the State Board of Equalization and Assessment.

§ 3-7. When effective.

This chapter shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State; provided, however, that such local law is subject to a permissive referendum, and the Village Clerk shall

forthwith proceed to notice such fact and conduct such referendum if required by petition.¹

§ 7-1. **Benefits of statute to be conferred upon employees.**

The Village Board of the Village of Canisteo hereby enacts this chapter to confer the benefits of § 18 of the Public Officers Law upon the employees of the Village of Canisteo and to be held liable for the costs incurred under that provision.

§ 7-2. **Definitions.**

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

EMPLOYEE — Includes all of those parties included in the definition of "employee" in Subdivision 1(b) of § 18 of the Public Officers Law, including those volunteers participating in any fire company or ambulance association providing services to the village.

§ 7-3. Text of statute incorporated by reference.

The text of § 18 of the Public Officers Law is incorporated by reference.¹

Chapter 11

ETHICS, CODE OF

§ 11-1. Adoption of code.

§ 11-1. Adoption of code.

This Board hereby adopts the Canisteo Code of Ethics as hereinafter set out in conformance with § 806 of the General Municipal Law.

§ 11-2. Standards of conduct.

- A. No trustee, officer or employee of the Village of Canisteo shall have any direct or indirect interest in any concern selling goods or services to the village.
- B. No officer of the village or member of any Board created by the village government shall vote for or otherwise influence any action of the village and thereby secure any material gain for himself or any of his relatives or business associates. When any such member faces such a conflict of interest, he shall make full disclosure of such conflict to his fellow associates in government and thereupon abstain from voting on the matter.
- C. No trustee, officer or employee shall favor or cause to be favored any concern or individual over another in doing business with the village, except to ensure that the interests of the village shall, at all times, be paramount.

- D. In the event that any trustee, officer or employee of the village shall ever be undecided as to the possibility of a conflict of interest, the presumption shall be in favor of a conflict and full disclosure of the facts shall be made to the Mayor and Board of Trustees.
- E. The only remuneration anyone associated with the Canisteeo Village government shall receive, directly or indirectly, shall be those payments for which vouchers have been duly submitted and for which the trustees in regular assemblage have duly approved.

§ 19-1. Summary publication to be deemed sufficient.

In the discretion of the Village Board, the publication of a local law or an amendment to local law may consist of a summary thereof and need not consist of the entire text of the law or amendment. Such publication of a summary shall be deemed sufficient publication.

In addition to the other legal requirements or prohibitions, the residency requirements for election or appointment to and continuance in the office of Village Justice of the Village of Canistota, Steuben County, New York, shall be that any such appointed or elected officer must reside within the County of Steuben and the State of New York.
